# MECR tasks in the field of energy and RES

- energy issues are governed by ministry of industry and trade (MIT)
- MECR is responsible for climate change mitigation, air protection and for reduction of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions
- longterm support of RES and energy conservation - mainly in households and non-commercial category of sources such as municipalities) – here are subvention programmes
- MECR participated in the creation of law on support of RES (Czech Act 180/2005 Sb.
- MECR cooperates with MIT in legislation process



# Current state

- Act No. 406/2000 Sb., on energy conservation
- Decree No. 148/2007 Sb., on energy performance of buildings – stipulates methodology of evaluation of energy performance as well as corresponding requirements and format and contents of the energy certificate of building
  
- Gestion – MIT
- specific working group
- Deadline for the EPBD directive transposition is June 2012 (2 years after the directive entered into effect)



## European Performance Building Directive - EPBD

- EPBD 2002/91/ES was essentially amended: need to rewrite it for better transparency was approved
- European Commission already approved draft amendment of this directive
- Goal – quick start of effective building and refurbishing of buildings to achieve high level of energy performance; concurrently emphasis to take into account capacities of various member states as well as possibilities of building owners and at the same time effort to minimise related administration burdens



# Revising EPBD – major changes

- amended text – Directive 2010/31/ES was approved by European Parliament on May 18th 2010
- the text stipulates national plans for increasing number of buildings with energy demand approaching zero
- the text stipulates also new compulsory standards and minimal requirements for new buildings
- the text defines new general framework for calculation of the energy performance
- the text requires that minimum level of energy performance stipulated by member states complies with requirements for optimal costs level
- the text revise existing as well introduction of new measures to decrease energy consumption of buildings



# Transposition time schedule for Czech legislation and practice

- **June 2011** – member states submit list of existing and future financing tools for support of energy conservation in buildings
- **June 2012** – (2 years after EPBD enters into effect) transposition of EPBD into national legislation must be finished
- **December 2012** – full compliance with the most of stipulated requirements of EPBD (particularly energy performance of public buildings, certificates of energy performance (CEP) in addition to new buildings also in old buildings where at least 500 m<sup>2</sup> has nature of space for public)
- **June 2013** – energy performance requirements apply to all buildings
- **December 2018** – all new public buildings have energy consumption near to zero
- **December 2020** – all new buildings have energy consumption near to zero
